JEWELLERY

Children may wear small plain stud earrings if they have their ears pierced, but earrings must not be worn for PE lessons. Pupils should remove earrings themselves before PE lessons and place in a named purse/coin bag. Younger children may struggle to remove and replace earrings themselves and it is advisable not to wear them on PE days.

Covering earrings with tape gives perception of safety but it is not recommended as tape can fall off and does not reduce the risk of compression injury.

Watches may be worn at the owner's risk.

HAIR

Long hair (longer than shoulder length) should be tied back. No fashion hairstyles.
