Maths focus:

Place value - four digit numbers addition and subtraction — two step problems Statistics — line graphs, timetables Multiplication and division — multiples, factors, prime numbers, square and cube numbers Perimeter and area of rectilinear shapes

History: Anglo-Saxons & Vikings

In this unit, we will be exploring invasion, power and settlements.

Where are English people from?

How much rivalry was there between Saxons and Vikings?

Was England always a Christian country?

What were the everyday lives of the Saxons and Vikings in England like?

<u>French: with Mrs Donald:</u> In this unit children will learn about school objects, school subjects, what they wear to school and what they eat at school. They will express their opinion and make more complex sentences using nouns, adjectives and conjunctions. They will continue to use the verb to have and learn about "er" verbs by using porter (to wear) and manger (to eat).

<u>Computing:</u> Children's will be using the internet effectively and critically, locating and selecting information that will support their learning in our topic. They will create and edit video footage to produce a presentation about Saxon & Viking life.

<u>**RE:</u>** The concept of God. We will be identifying different types of biblical texts and explain how these influence the Christian view of God. We will reflect on how Christians put these beliefs into practice in worship. Incarnation: explain the place of Incarnation and Messiah within the 'big story' of the Bible.</u>

<u>Art</u>: We will be creating illuminated letters.

English focus: Narrative writing & a discussion text
