

Maths focus: Place value and Addition and subtraction.

- In year four we work with four-digit numbers, so they need to have an appreciation of the value of 1000 and how large it is.
- We will be estimating numbers by rounding them to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. You could ask children to help you estimate how much the shopping will cost.
- Revise number bonds to 10 and 100. For example, if I'm 73, how many more years until I'm 100. If there are 376 cars in the car park, how many more until there are 400.

Science: Teeth and digestion

- In this topic we will be investigating different types of teeth and how they help us eat our food. We will also look at the teeth of animals to find out their diet.
- We will also investigate where our food goes when we swallow and what function the organs perform to help digest our food.

You could discuss the importance of keeping teeth healthy and what we need to do this. Why are sugary drinks and


