# Spelling and SPAG

Recognising and using types of sentences, thinking about their purpose. Grammar skills: relative clauses, fronted adverbials, noun phrases. Punctuation focus on commas to separate clauses, colons and speech punctuation.

# Enquiry question: What makes us civilised? Historical context-The Ancient Sumer and The Golden Age of Islam

<u>Things we will discuss and learn about this term</u>: What do we mean by civilisation and what other civilisations have you learned about? What were the achievements of the earliest civilisation? Where and when was the Sumerian civilisation and what are its key features? Why did Sumer develop such an advanced civilisation? What legacy did it leave for us and why do we study this today? Why was Baghdad so important between 700CE and 1000CE? What was happening in Europe at the same time? What was life like in Baghdad? What is the House of Wisdom and why was it important? Trade and the Silk Road.

<u>Vocabulary</u>: Civilisation, empire, attitudes, B.C. Iraq, Fertile Crescent, Middle East, democracy, motive, stereotypes, propaganda, bias, reliability, free classes, reliability Sumer, Ziggurat.

<u>Science</u>: Fossils, geological time and classification. How do we know about the past? What is evolution and how do we know that it happened? How are fossils formed? Classification of life including the 5 kingdoms. <u>Vocabulary</u>: Million, billion, evolution, extinct, fossil, palaeontologist, organism, microorganism, bacteria, microscope.

<u>Evolution and inheritance</u>: The children will recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents. They will\_identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution and how Charles Darwin discovered the process of Evolution by Natural selection. <u>Vocabulary:</u> Evolution, natural selection, population, variation, competition, adapted, offspring, inheritance, Charles Darwin, Lamarck, HMS Beagle

Art: Islamic patterns-printing workshop with Ashmolean Museum. Muslim Calligraphy artists.

RE: Theme/Unit: What does it mean if God is Holy and Loving? What does it mean to be a Muslim today? Muslim traditions - Eid-ul-Fitr

**<u>PSHE:</u>** How can we be civilised? Belonging to a community, valuing diversity, challenging discrimination and stereo types.
