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EARA



A group of children are working with Hampshire as part of the New Forest EARA (equality and rights advocates group).

The EARA group aims to address many of the nine characteristics protected under the Equalities Act of 2010. They consider how prejudicial attitudes and behaviours towards those who share those characteristics impact on our school community. The group decides which aspects to focus on and discuss ways in which to advocate within their school.

Fundamental to the ethos of the group is the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and the articles contained therein. The group uses the convention as a tool to underpin

and empower the work they undertake to promote the rights of every child. Participation is a key driver for the Convention (Article 12) and thus the EARA group provides young people with a platform to have their voices heard and to provide those vulnerable groups within their school and wider community with an opportunity to be heard also.

Our EARA group attended the first termly meeting on Thursday. This provided an opportunity to share good practice across the county. We look forward to hearing more about their work in the future.

E-Safety

This week the cyber ambassadors have expressed concerns about the types of video games being played and have some advice about age-ratings. Every game comes with a PEGI rating which indicates how suitable a game is for a certain age in terms of content, not ability. A game with PEGI rating of 16 or 18 would have themes of violence, bad language and fear. The biggest risk to ignoring age-ratings is that children will be exposed to inappropriate and even traumatic content. Call of Duty and Grand Theft Auto are often games that are talked about amongst peers, and both these games have extreme levels of violence and incredibly mature content.

To summarise:

Games come with PEGI ratings of 3, 7, 12, 16 and 18. The higher the rating the more mature content there is. It does not indicate difficulty level.
